## Treatment Plant Operators

**W**ater and Wastewater plant operators protect public health and the environment. They work with sophisticated equipment to remove potentially harmful contaminants from drinking water before it is consumed and from wastewater before it is returned to the environment. Operators ensure that all Federal, State, and local water standards are met 24-hours a day, 365-days a year.

The Water and Wastewater fields need new operators. Close to 50% of all treatment plant operators are expected to retire in the next seven to ten years. Jobs in water and



wastewater treatment provide excellent pay, benefits, and promotional opportunities. It is a career for a lifetime.
